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15th FINA World Masters Championships

The 15th FINA World Masters Championships will be taking place in Montréal, Canada from Sunday, 27th July until Sunday, 10th August. There are estimates that over 6000 competitors from around the world will be attending, including one from Colne ASC.

The first week involves synchronized swimming and water polo, with diving and swimming in the second week. The open water race closes the event on Sunday, 10th August.

The competition will be held at the Parc Jean-Drapeau Aquatic Complex on an island in the middle of the St. Lawrence Seaway. The Aquatic Complex includes one 10 lane main competition pool, one recreational pool with 8 lanes as well as a world class diving tank. All the events apart from the open water will take place here. The open water will take place in the rowing basin along side the Gilles Villeneuve Circuit on the nearby Notre-Dame Island.

Our Club Chairman and Masters swimmer Philip Croxall will be competing in the 45 to 49 years age group in four events; 100m and 200m Breaststroke, 200m Individual Medley and 400m Freestyle.

He sets off on his adventure to Canada on Friday, 1st August, with his first event, being 100m Breaststroke on Monday, 4th August. The 200m Individual Medley is on Wednesday, 6th August, the 200m Breaststroke is on Friday, 8th August. He finally finishes the week with the 400m Freestyle on Saturday, 9th August.

When asked about his chances and visiting Canada, he said, "I'm looking forward to this competition, as it has been a few years since I have competed at this level. Achieving a top 20 place in any of my events would be a massive bonus, especially having been hampered by niggling injuries over the last few years. From what I have read over the last few months, Montréal is a fascinating city, I just can't wait to get there."

He has been sponsored by Engineering & Foundry Supplies Ltd (Colne) who have provided him with a t-shirt and hoodie, especially embroidered for the event.

Stephen Frost the owner of E & F Supplies said, "We are very pleased at Engineering & Foundry Supplies to support Philip at the World Masters in Canada and hope he does well. British Masters Championships

The **British Gas Masters and Senior Age Group Championships 2014** were held at the **Wales National Pool** in Swansea from Friday, 13th June until Sunday, 16th June and were contested by over 600 participants, of which, there were two from the Colne ASC masters team. They were **Karen Driver** swimming in the 40-44 years age group and **Philip Croxall** in the 45 to 49 years age group.

A new British record was set in the Womens 4 x 200m Freestyle Relay in 160 to 199 years age group as Karen was part of a quartet of women swimming for the **Sub 160 Masters** team along with Nicola Latty from Oundle, Jessica Wooddisse from Stroud Masters and Sandra Jones from Gloucester Masters. Between them they recorded a time of 9 minutes 48.83 seconds, knocking 16.09 seconds off the old record.

On Day One of the Championships, Karen finished 2nd in the 1500m Freestyle event in a time of 19 minutes 46.07 seconds and Philip finished 8th in the 200m Individual Medley in a time of 2 minutes 42.76 seconds.



Day two saw both Karen and Philip contest the 400m Freestyle, where they both finished 5th in their respective events. Karen in a time of 5 minutes 10.46 seconds and Philip in 4 minutes 59.40 seconds. In the afternoon Philip finished in 2nd place in the 200m Breaststroke in a time of 3 minutes 0.14 seconds.

Day three started with Philip finishing in 4th place in the 100m Breaststroke with a time of 1 minutes 23.64 seconds. Then it was the turn of Karen and her three friends in the 800m Freestyle relay. They were up against Basingstoke Bluefins who

were the current record holders.

Karen was up first and she opened up a 4.5 second lead on the first leg, but that advantage was lost as Sandra was next. With the teams level Jessica followed by Nicola opened up large gap as they beat the Basingstoke team by 11 seconds.

Finally Karen just had her 800m Freestyle where she finished 1st in 10 minutes 23.39 seconds.

North West Region Masters

On Sunday, 6th July, two members of the Colne ASC Masters Team travelled to the Palatine Leisure Centre in Blackpool for the ASA North West Region Open Masters Championships.

The overall positions for each event were calculated using an age adjustment formula so that a 25 year old could be compared against a 60 year old.

Swimming in the 45 to 49 years age group was Philip Croxall, who was using this event as a build up to the forthcoming World Masters Championships which are being held in Montréal, Canada in August.

Philip finished 1st in 400m Freestyle and was 9th overall, he also finished 2nd (11th overall) in 100m Breaststroke, 2nd (5th overall) in the 200m Individual Medley and was 1st (10th overall) in the 200m Breaststroke.

Swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group was Daniel Dawson who finished 2nd (16th overall) in the 50m Backstroke, 2nd (28th overall) in the 100m Freestyle, 1st (17th overall) in the 100m Breaststroke, 1st (28th overall) in the 50m Breaststroke and 3rd (40th overall) in the 50m Freestyle.
