ASA National Masters

The ASA National Masters and Senior Age Group Championships (25m) 2015 were held at the Ponds Forge International Sports Centre, Sheffield over the weekend from Friday, 23rd October until Sunday, 25th October. Over 1200 competitors from around the country descended upon Sheffield for three days of competition with two from Colne ASC.

Philip Croxall was competing in the 45 to 49 years age group in 6 events over the three days. On the Friday he took part in the 200m Individual Medley where he finished 10th in 2:36.09 which was his best time for over 4 years. He then finished 8th in the 100m Breaststroke in a time of 1:18.07 again his best for over 4 years.

On the Saturday he started with a 5th place in the 400m Freestyle in a time of 4:47.26, which was followed by a 14th place in the 50m Breaststroke in 35.32 seconds, with both swims his best for over 4 years. Finally he finished 5th in the 200m Breaststroke in a time of 2:55.76, his best over the last 2 years.

His final event of the weekend took place in the 400m Individual Medley where he finished 7th in 5:43.58, which yet again was his best in the last 3 years.

Karen Driver was only competing in the 160 years plus 4 x 200m Freestyle relay for the Sub 160 Masters (Colne) where she was swimming with Nicola Latty, Sarah Collins and Jessica Wooddisse. They won their event in 9:22.16, but were unable to improve their own European Record as they missed out by 10 seconds on the time they set last year.

ASA County Team Championships

Miranda Bower, the Colne ASC swimmer who trains with the Burnley BOBCATS, was selected to swim for Lancashire in the ASA County Team Championships 2015 on Sunday, 18th October at the Ponds Forge International Sports Centre, Sheffield. The reigning county champions Lancashire won a 14th consecutive title with 493 points with Yorkshire 2nd on 447 points and Somerset 3rd on 424 points.

Miranda was swimming in the 100m Breaststroke in the girls 14/15 years age group. She finished in 8th place with highly respectable time of 1 minute 13.59 seconds, which smashed her personal best for the event. In the process she achieved a qualifying time for the British Olympic Trials in April 2016.

Over the course of the year she has lowered her personal best by over 13 seconds!

AGM Report

There was a disappointing turn-out at this years Annual General Meeting, which resulted in plenty of food for those who turned up. This consisted of the same people.

The Committee remains unchanged from the Frontcrawl for girls 14 years and previous year.

Also any swimmer can do the Senior Championship and 200m IM events which are open to all, and anyone 15 and under can do the Junior Championship events.

The Mary Lane Trophy has been renamed the Laura Foulkes Memorial Trophy. It is still 100m

So come on have a go it's free as you've already paid for entry as part of your subscription to the Club.

You will be assessed on Backstroke, Breaststroke and Frontcrawl over two lengths, with starts and turns included.

So it doesn't matter if you are fast or slow, it is the person with the best stroke and technique that wins.

You can enter on-line, fill in a form or just turn up at the Pendle Leisure Centre just before 3:00pm.

Oh and it is **free**! You just need to turn up. Plus Burnley's fixture is on Sunday so it won't interfere.

Blackpool Lights Meet

On the weekend of Saturday, 31st October and Sunday, 1st November a team of 6 young swimmers from Colne ASC travelled to the Palatine Leisure Centre, Blackpool to compete in the Blackpool Lights Meet 2015. Colne's best performer was Zak Smith-Shelley who came away with a gold, 2 silvers and a bronze.

Danielle Baxter (13 years) finished 13th in the 50m Butterfly, 14th in the 200m Individual Medley, the 100m Freestyle, the 200m Freestyle and the 50m Freestyle, 15th in the 100m Breaststroke and the 100m Individual Medley, 16th in the 50m Breaststroke, and 17th in the 50m Backstroke.

Jac Smith-Shelley (11 years) finished 4th in the 200m Backstroke, 7th in the 200m Freestyle, 8th in the 50m Backstroke and the 100m Backstroke, 10th in the 50m Freestyle and the 50m Butterfly, 13th in the 100m Freestyle and the 100m Individual Medley.

Zak Smith-Shelley (13 years) finished 1st in the 100m Backstroke, 2nd in the 50m Butterfly and the 100m Individual Medley, 3rd in the 100m Butterfly, 4th in the 100m Freestyle, 5th in the 100m Backstroke and the 50m Freestyle, 8th in the 200m Freestyle, and 9th in the 50m Breaststroke.

Mia Dodman (11 years) finished 11th in the 100m Backstroke, 20th in the 200m Freestyle and the 50m Freestyle, 23rd in the 100m Freestyle, and 25th in the 50m Backstroke.

Saskia Daly (11 years) finished 17th in the 50m Freestyle, 29th in the 50m Backstroke, and 31st in the 100m Freestyle.

Eleanor Root (13 years) finished 11th in the 200m Freestyle and 17th in the 50m Freestyle.
