

Micro League

On Saturday, 23rd April, the young team from Colne ASC travelled up the motorway to Salt Ayre Sports Centre in Lancaster for our next fixture in the Micro League of the North West. We were up against our hosts Carnforth B and teams from Blackpool B and Lytham St. Annes. Unfortunately, due to the Easter holidays, the Colne team was severely depleted as we had to forfeit 15 of the 49 races due to a lack of swimmers.

Despite this set back, the team managed to win 9 races and hold there own against the other teams, it was just the lack of swimmers that was telling. In the end they finished in 4th place with 79 points.

The gala was won jointly by Carnforth B and Lytham St. Annes, as both teams finished with 130 points. In third place was Blackpool B, who finished on 90 points.

Our next fixture is away at the Darwen Leisure Centre on Sunday, 15th May as we take on hosts Garstang and teams from Leyland B and Preston B.

The coach leaves the Pendle Leisure Centre at 1:15pm with the warm-up starting at 2:15pm.

How far you go with Masters swimming is up to you. The broad objectives are better health, getting fit, and friendship between swimmers.

Harrogate Spa Town A/B Grade Meet

The 2016 Spa Town Graded Meet was held at the Hydro in Harrogate on the weekend of 2nd and 3rd of April.

There were just two swimmers from Colne taking part, and they were Saskia Daly and Mia Dodman who were both competing in the 11 year old age group.

Saskia finished 11th in the 50m Freestyle with an A Grade time, 12th in the 100m Breaststroke with a B Grade time, 13th in 50m Butterfly with a B Grade time, 13th in the 100m Freestyle with a B Grade time, 10th in the 50m Backstroke with a B Grade time, 8th in the 200m Freestyle with a B Grade time, 14th in the 50m Breaststroke with a B Grade time, and 8th in the 100m Backstroke with a B Grade time.

Mia finished 20th in the 50m Freestyle with an A Grade time, 9th in 50m Butterfly with a B Grade time, 6th in the 100m Freestyle with a B Grade time, 7th in the 50m Backstroke with a B Grade time, 7th in the 200m Freestyle with a B Grade time, 15th in the 50m Breaststroke with a B Grade time, and 6th in the 100m Backstroke with a B Grade time.

A sole representative from the Colne ASC Masters Team travelled up to the Aberdeen Sports Village Aquatics Centre to compete in the **Scottish Masters Short Course Championships 2016**. The meet took place on Friday, 22nd and Saturday, 23rd April.

Tony Catterall was swimming in the 70 to 74 years age group where he finished 1st in the 800m Freestyle, 400m Individual Medley, 200m Backstroke, 200m Individual Medley, 200m Freestyle, 50m Backstroke, 400m Freestyle and 100m Backstroke. He was 2nd in the 100m Freestyle, 100m Breaststroke, 100m Individual Medley, 200m Breaststroke and 50m Freestyle, and 3rd in the 50m Breaststroke.

As a result of all his swims, he won the top male award for his age group.

Age Group Swimming

Interested in taking swimming more seriously, then you need to be taking part in Age Group Galas. These galas take place most weekends all over the country. We as a Club target events that you should be able to compete at.

If you would like to do competitions, then have a word with your teacher, or Chief Coach Andrew Croxall.

In 2020 it will be an Olympic year, but if you don't enter competitions, then you will have no chance of reaching the Olympics.

This year Club member Miranda Bower, who trains at Bobcats, qualified to swim at the Olympic trials in March, and she only started down that path by competing at the low level external galas.
