# Harrogate Autumn Meet

On Sunday, 20th November, three swimmers from Colne ASC took part in the Harrogate **District Swimming Club's 2016 Autumn Meet** at the Harrogate Hydro.

Rachel Leigh swimming in the 14 years age group finished 1st in the 100m Breaststroke, 2nd in the 50m Breaststroke, 3rd in the 100m Freestyle, 4th in the 200m Freestyle and the 50m Freestyle, and 5th in the 100m Backstroke.

Charlotte Leigh swimming in the 12 years age group finished 1st in the 100m Breaststroke, 2nd in the 50m Butterfly, 3rd in the 200m Individual Medley and 5th in the 50m and 100m Freestyle.

Saskia Daly swimming in the 12 years age group finished 2nd in the 50m and 100m Freestyle, 5th in the 50m Butterfly and 9th in the 50m Breaststroke.

### **Preston Christmas Countdown**

There were two members of Colne ASC taking part in the Preston Swimming Club Christmas Countdown Meet 2016 at the Darwen Pool on Sunday, 4th December.

Saskia Daly (12 years) finished 16th in the 50m Butterfly, 18th in the 100m Freestyle and 8th in the 50m Freestyle.

Mia Dodman (12 years) finished 12th in the 50m Butterfly, 16th in the 100m Freestyle and 15th in the 50m Freestyle.

# **Inter-County Masters**

On Sunday, 20th November the ASA Masters & Senior Inter-County Championships for the northern region of England was held at the Palatine Leisure Centre in Blackpool. There were three members of the Colne ASC Masters Team swimming for Lancashire.

Tony Catterall was swimming in the 65 years and over category in which he had two individual swims in 50m Breaststroke and 50m Backstroke, along with two relay swims doing Freestyle and Backstroke.

Stephen Tyler was swimming in the 45 years and over category in which he had two relay swims, both of which were Freestyle.

Philip Croxall was also swimming in the 45 years and over category in which he had an individual 50m Butterfly swim plus a relay swim also doing Butterfly.

The host county this year was Lancashire who extended invitations to Cumbria, Cheshire, Northumberland & Durham, and Yorkshire, who were the reigning County Champions. As defending champions, Yorkshire proved too strong for the other counties as they won the contest with a massive 292 points. The battle for second was between Lancashire and Cheshire, with former eventually finishing 2nd on 205 points with Cheshire in third on 189 points. Northumberland and Durham finished in fourth place on 156 points with Cumbria finishing on 117 points.

After a few weeks the results from the various meets were collated to work out the County Champions for 2016, which went to Hampshire.

Hampshire secured the ASA National Masters & Senior Inter County Championships title after an impressive performance in the South East Region.

The South Coast county scored 1524 points in their regional competition at The Leys Pool in Oxford.

Having won the past two years, Yorkshire won the North Region event to finish second overall on 1500. Meanwhile Warwickshire – champions between 2011 and 2013 – were third nationally on 1458.

Hampshire landed 28 points for overall victories in 16 of the 68 events, including eight relays.
