We all stayed in a youth hostel along with a German team from Bitterfelder (in East Germany), and a French team from Creil (north of Paris), who were also involved in the twinning association. All of us used our language skills, trying to speak to the French and German, although their English was amazing. This came in good practice for school. Every evening we all went to the local community centre where food was provided for everyone. Here we would socialise with fellow competitors. It was there that we became good friends with the swimmers especially the French as they were keen on the idea of having English friends.

As we woke up early for the gala on the Sunday we had an excited but nervous team. These nerves soon disappeared when we arrived at the pool along with the other swimmers ready for a day of friendly international swimming. We were given the choice of races including 50m, 100m and 200m in frontcrawl, breaststroke, and backstroke, 50m and 100m in butterfly and 100m and 200m in the Individual Medley. Points were given to the first swimmer of each club in each event. After the individual events we were given the chance to race in an international relay event with the other swimmers from Germany and France. Overall we came 6th place. However most of our swimmers came in the top 3 of their age groups. In particular in the 12 and under age group Caitlin Harper came 2nd, in the 13 and under age group, Saskia Daly came 1st, Charlotte Leigh -2nd and Mia Dodman-3rd. In the 15 and under age group Eleanor Fuggle came 2nd.

After a day of friendly competition we went back to the youth hostel where we played a game of basketball with the French, followed by another wonderful meal. After a night of chatting and not much sleep, we set off for a morning of climbing. Along with the German and French teams we went to a forest where we climbed in the treetops, like at Go Ape in this country. After our climbing session we went to the shopping centre where we were provided with lunch again. Here we said our goodbyes to the Bitterfelder team before they left for home. After lunch we got the chance to go shopping before our tour round the town hall. Here we met the mayor and saw the inside of the town hall as well as the view of Marl from the rooftop. We learnt that from Marl to Pendle it was 676 Km. They very proudly showed us an oak tree that had been given to the town on Marl, as a sapling from Pendle many years ago. It was now considerably larger.

After another busy day we went for our last evening meal at the community centre before heading back to the hostel. On the Tuesday morning we packed our suitcases, said goodbye to the hostel and headed out to the Volksparkfest, which was a festival celebrating German reunification. October 3rd is the day many will remember the falling of the Berlin wall. Here we were invited onto the stage along with the French team and thanked by the Mayor of Marl for visiting and competing. We had some time to explore at the festival and sample the German food as well as buying souvenirs, before meeting the Creil team one last time and saying goodbye to them. Before they left we swapped swim hats with them giving us all something to take back with us to our home countries. After the French left we headed back to the community centre for lunch before our journey back. At the community centre we were met by some German and Polish exchange students. Once we had eaten lots of pizza, the Polish students taught everyone some dances. Soon it was time to say goodbye and we headed back to the airport after a really enjoyable trip. I think we all wish we could go again. We are all really thankful for the experience and hope we can meet the German and French teams again at some point.

Colne then pegged them back during the Backstroke races. The honours for the Medley Relay races were shared as Great Harwood won the 13 years and under, and Colne the Open age group.

It was then nip and tuck between the two teams throughout the Breaststroke and Freestyle events, leaving the contest level with three races to go. Colne went on to win the two open freestyle races to leave them 2 points ahead with just the 8 x 25m Canon Relay to come.

The race started with the 10 year girls followed by the boys, and it was level. It was the same for both the 13 year and 16 year and under age group, just leaving the last two legs for the open swimmers, and it was still level. Then on the finish of the last length the Colne swimmer stretched out his arm to touch out the Great Harwood swimmer.

It was a pulsating finish as Colne beat Great Harwood by 57 points to 54.

Throughout the course of the evening, the Colne swimmers managed 33 new personal bests between them, with 18 amongst the boys and 15 for the girls.

On Monday, 23rd October, Colne ASC hosted Accrington SC in our final fixture in this season's North East Lancs Friendly League.

It was a close contest as Colne, and then Accrington took it turns to win races, with one race even being declared a dead heat. With three races to go Accrington lead by a point, then Colne won the ladies open 50m freestyle, but Accrington replied by winning the gents.

It was down to the last race the 8 by 25m canon relay (1 swimmer boy and girl from the 4 age groups), and Colne had to win to tie the contest. Accrington mixed up the order and opened up a lead, but then Colne came back and was level with 25m to go. The Accrington swimmer powered down the last length to win, but no Accrington had been disqualified, but before Colne could celebrate, they too got disqualified for a faulty take over.

This meant the Accrington held on to beat Colne by 53 points to 52.

Over the course of the evening the young Colne swimmers managed a further 32 new personal bests with 16 amongst the boys and 16 for the girls.

Betty Petty Style Competition

On Monday, 6th and Thursday, 9th November we held the **Betty Petty Style Competition** using lane one.

There were a total of 11 boys and 16 girls that participated in both parts of the competition. The swimmers were judged on their ability to perform a backstroke start and turn whilst swimming two lengths of backstroke. They then performed the grab start for the two lengths of breaststroke and used the track start for the two lengths of frontcrawl.

The results from both nights will be announced at the Annual Presentation on Saturday, 16th December, at the Nelson Cricket Club.
