A group of four swimmers took on one of the oldest swimming challenges in crossing from Europe to Asia. This swim took place in Turkey crossing the Dardaneles Straight. We shall be uplot the month of Ser

Taking on the challenge were Club members Bob Whittaker and Steve Tyler, Club teacher Mark Turner and weekend masters swimmer Cathy Garrett.

They took to the water at Hellespont and set off for the finish at Dardanelles for a 4.6km swim. The waters were clear but the current was strong as all four missed the finish, and had to swim back against the current!

The first one to complete the challenge was Bob who finished 66th in 53 minutes. Steve made it after an hour in 112th place, with Cathy finishing 44th in women's event in 1 hour 7 minutes, and Mark completed the swim in 1 hour 12 minutes and was 8th in his age group.

Steve said "All went well but could have done better. We all managed to misjudge the current, overshot the finish and ended up having to swim hard back upstream. Everyone finished in the top ten for there age group though. A spectacular swim with Clear, warm (20DegC +) water. Beautiful (none stinging) jellyfish and dolphins. What more could you ask for other than a good finishing time!!" After the event all swimmers were invited to a meal to replenish the calories lost.
