# World Masters 2004 - Riccione Italy

The World Masters were held in Italy from 1st to the 13th June at 2 venues, Riccione, situated on the Adriatic, and San Marino. The Swimming, Synchronized Swimming and Diving events were held in Riccione at the updated Stadio del Neuto (Swimming Stadium), which now boasts two 50 metre pools, one indoor and one outdoor. The Open Water was held in the sea off Riccione. The Water Polo event was held in the Principality of San Marino.

There were over 8000 competitors from 68 nations entered in the competition with about 6300 entered in the Swimming events.

On the first day of the competition the men used the outdoor pool and the women the indoor one. The second day had the women outdoors and the men indoors. This pattern was repeated for the duration of the swimming events.

Philip Croxall swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group was the sole representative of the Club.

He swam in the 200 metres Individual Medley and set a new personal best of 2:37.14 and finished 26th out of 72.

In the 200 metres Breaststroke he set a new best long course time of 2:56.96 and finished 37th out of 91.

In the 100 metres Breaststroke he finished 49th out 134 in a time of 1:19.69 which was yet again a best long course time.

In the 200 metres Freestyle he finished 35th out of 96 in a time of 2:19.83 which also was a best time in a 50 metre pool.

The next World Masters are to be held in San Francisco in August 2006.

# Hygiene, Safety and Presentation

Swimmers should also wear the suitable swimming attire for their lessons. That means no shorts. They may be alright for the beach, but completely unsuitable for swimming.

All swimmers must remove ALL jewellery before entering the water.
