Central Lancashire Championships - Top Club

On the 8th April, we had 23 swimmers competing at the Central Lancashire Championships & Age Groups (Manchester Aquatics) built on the success of last year's championship. A total of 32 medals were achieved on the day with seventeen 1st places, seven 2nd and eight 3rd places, with no fewer than 76 personal best times.

In the 9yr Age Group a lot of the swimmers were competing for the very first time, added to the fact it was in a 50m pool (two lengths at Colne) which made it even more daunting, gave a good account of themselves. The outstanding swimmer was Morgan Hartley who achieved three 1st places in the 50m Breaststroke, Freestyle and Butterfly races and a 2nd place in the 50m Backstroke. The other medallist was Jack Coyne who finished 3rd in the 50m



Freestyle. Other swimmers in this age group included Olivia Pratt, Thomas Flanagan and Callum Rilev.

In the 10yr Age Group Francesca Harrison-Bradley and Ainsley Dibb produced personal best times.

In the 11yr Age Group **Chris Bates** achieved a 2nd place in the 50m Breaststroke and **Rhys Moore** achieved a 3rd place in the 50m Butterfly. Other swimmers in this age group included Charlotte Beech and Molly Frankland.

In the 12yr Age Group **Emily Cott** achieved three 1st places in the 50m Backstroke, Freestyle and Butterfly races with a 3rd place in the 50m Breaststroke. The other medallist was James Blackburn who finished 1st in the 50m Backstroke in a personal best time. Other swimmers in this age group were Kieron Hartley who produced six personal best times from six swims and Bethany

In the 13yr Age Group **Sam Bainbridge** achieved a 2nd place in the 50m Freestyle and a 3rd place in the 50m Breaststroke.

In the 14yr Age Group Laura Foulkes achieved a 1st place in the Open 50m Freestyle Junior and three 2nd places in the 50m Freestyle, Butterfly, Open 50m Freestyle Senior and a 3rd place in the 50m Breaststroke. The other medallist was Ashley **Honeyman** who finished 3rd in the 50m Breaststroke.

In the Open Age Group William Harrison achieved eight 1st places from four swims by winning the Junior and Senior age groups in the Open 100m Backstroke, Butterfly, Freestyle and Open 50m Freestyle events, all in personal best times. The other medalists were **Kathleen Walsh** who finished 2nd in the Open 50m Freestyle Junior resulting in a 3rd in the Senior, and Matthew Lonsdale who finished 3rd in the Open 100m Butterfly in a personal best time. Other swimmers competing in the Opens were Emma Scott-Miller and Natalie Cowgill.

In the final event of the day, the Mixed Open Age 4 x 50m Freestyle Team, Colne swimmers Laura Foulkes, Emily Cott, Matthew Lonsdale and William Harrison produced a superb team performance by bringing home the gold in a time of 1:52.85.

The meet was rounded off with the news that Colne ASC were awarded the Top Club Trophy for gaining the most points on the day.

Scottish National Masters Championships

On Friday and Saturday, 21st and 22nd April, four members of the Colne ASC Masters Team took part in the Scottish National Short Course Masters Championships held at the Tollcross Park Leisure Centre, Glasgow.

Karen Driver swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group was in very good form despite suffering with a shoulder injury competed in the 200m, 400m and 800m Freestyle events. She won all of them in new personal best times and also was the fastest female swimmer overall in those events.

Tony Catterall swimming in the 60 to 64 years age group also won all of his events as he competed in 400m and 800m Freestyle, 200m and 400m Individual Medley, 200m Backstroke, 200m Breaststroke and 200m Butterfly.

Bob Whittaker swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group finished 3rd in 800m Freestyle in a new personal best time, 3rd in 200m Freestyle and 4th in 400m Freestyle setting a new personal best time.

Philip Croxall swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group finished 3rd in 200m Breaststroke, 4th in 100m Freestyle, 5th in 100m Breaststroke and 5th in 200m Individual Medley.

Lancashire County Championships

On the 11-12th March weekend, Colne ASC had five swimmers competing at the **Lancashire County Championships & Age Groups** (Manchester Aquatics), Sessions No.1 to 4. A total of four medals were achieved over the weekend with one 2nd and three 3rd places, reaching no fewer than five finals between them, 17 personal best times, with 6 ASA North West Region qualifying times.

Sam Bainbridge competing in the 12yr Age Group achieved two 3rd places in the finals of the 100m Breaststroke and 100m Freestyle, the latter in an ASA North West Age Group qualifying time and an 8th place in the 200m Freestyle.

Emily Cott competing in the 12yr Age Group produced seven personal best times from seven swims achieving a 3rd and 5th place in the finals of the 100m Freestyle and 100m Backstroke respectively, both ASA North West Age Group qualifying times, with an 8th place in the 50m Freestyle and a 9th place in the 200m Backstroke. In the 100m Freestyle Emily qualified for the final in a personal best time of 1:07.68 in joint 8th place, so had to swim-off to be in the final producing a 1:06.20, and in the final set a further personal best time of 1:05.73, knocking 2 seconds off her personal best time in the space of 2 hours and is now within 0.54 off her National Qualifying time for that distance.

Laura Foulkes competing in the 14yr Age Group achieved a 12^{th} place in the 50m Freestyle and a 20^{th} place in the 100m Freestyle, both personal best times in a 50m pool.

Joshua Finch competing in the 15yr Age Group achieved an 11th place in the 200m Freestyle and a 15th place in the 100m Freestyle achieving ASA North West Region Youth qualifying times in the process.

On the 18-19th March weekend, Colne ASC had six swimmers competing at the **Lancashire County Championships & Age Groups** (Manchester Aquatics), Sessions No.5 to 8. A total of 13 medals was achieved over the weekend with four 1st, six 2nd and four 3rd places, 17 personal best times, with 3 ASA North West Region and 1 ASA National qualifying times.

Morgan Hartley competing for the very first time in the 9yr Age Group achieved a 3rd place in the 50m Breaststroke, a 9th place in the 50m Butterfly, a 13th place in the 50m Freestyle and a 15th place in the 50m Backstroke all in personal best times.

Sam Bainbridge competing in the 12yr Age Group achieved a 1st place in the 50m Breaststroke, a 2nd place in the 50m Freestyle, and a 3nd place in the 50m Butterfly, all personal best times in a 50m pool.

Emily Cott competing in the 12yr Age Group achieved a 11th and 13th place in the 200m & 400m Freestyle respectively, both ASA North West Age Group qualifying times, with a 4th place in the 50m Backstroke, a 13th in the 50m Breaststroke and a 26th place in the 200m IM all in personal best times.

Joshua Finch competing in the 15yr Age Group achieved a 1st place in the 200m Butterfly, a 2nd place in the 50m Butterfly and a 9th place in the 50m Freestyle, the latter in an ASA North West Region Youth qualifying time.

William Harrison competing in the 16yr Age Group achieved a 1^{st} place in the 50m Backstroke and 50m Freestyle, the latter in an ASA National qualifying time, a 2^{nd} place in the 50m Butterfly and a 6^{th} place in the final of the 100m Open Freestyle. Further medals were gained in the junior (16yr & under) and senior (open) age groups for the above events as well which included two 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} places in the junior, and a 2^{nd} in the senior.

Matthew Lonsdale competing in the Open Age Group achieved a 16th in the 100m Freestyle, a 17th in the 50m Butterfly and 37th in the 50m Freestyle.

Micro League

Despite this, our young swimmers gave their all, and several got faster with each gala.

On Saturday 1st April, we were hosts to teams from Chorley, Preston 'B' and Garstang. The contest was fairly even among the four teams with Chorley having the slightly better results. Throughout the course of the night Colne's young swimmers achieved 27 personal bests in the 32 individual races.

After all the individual and relay races were swum there was one race left which was the cannon, which comprised a boy and girl from each age group to make a team of eight swimmers. At the juncture Colne and Preston 'B' were level on 117 points each and both teams were in lanes next to each other. So as each swimmer went in the noise level grew as Colne and Preston were neck and neck. In the end the final Preston swimmer had the better finish edging out the Colne swimmer.

On Sunday, 7th May, our young (9 - 12 years) swimmers travelled to Salt Ayre Pool in Lancaster to take part in the 2nd fixture.

We competed against teams from Clitheroe, Garstang and Lancaster. Despite a valiant effort it proved too much for the young swimmers as they finished behind all the other teams. Yet several of the swimmers did set new personal best times.

On Friday, 19th May, we travelled to Clitheroe's Ribblesdale Pool to compete against Clitheroe, Chorley and Garstang. It was another valiant effort with several swimmers yet again lowering their personal bests.

Bob Whittaker also swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group finished 2nd in 200m Freestyle, 2nd in 100m Backstroke in a new personal best time of 1:18.85, 2nd in 50m Backstroke, 4th 50m Butterfly and 7th 50m Freestyle.

Eva embraced life with such gusto taking on many challenges in her later life. She learnt to swim when she was 90 years young, proving that it's never too late. She also attended swimming classes at Pendle Leisure Centre even attending sessions in the gym, with such enthusiasm it was very difficult to realise just how old she was.

She was a very quiet unassuming person, never wanting a fuss to be made of her, but was always very bright and cheerful.

Four weeks ago she fell and broke her hip, and sadly never recovered from it. She passed away peacefully, just as she lived her life not wanting to be a bother to anyone.
