Friendly League

On Thursday, 7th September, the team travelled to the Hyndburn Sports Centre, Accrington, to take part in our latest fixture in the Friendly League against Pioneer '79. Over the course of the night the Colne swimmers picked up a further 16 personal bests between them, but it was to be in vain as Pioneer won the races at a ratio of 3 to 1 to run out winners by 70 points to 50.

On Monday, 18th September, the team travelled to Haslingden for the last fixture in the Friendly League, and rounded off the season in style in winning by 62 points to 55. It was difficult for any of the swimmers to know if they had set any new personal bests due to the Haslingden pool being only 25 yards long (about 22.86m) as opposed to 25 metres as it is at Pendle Leisure Centre.

This victory means that we have avoided the relegation swim-offs against the winners of division two.

The Swim-Offs take place on Friday, 17th November at the Pendle Leisure Centre. Warm-up starts at 7:00pm.

Warburtons Galas

On Sunday the 8th October, 17 swimmers competed at the **Warburtons Central Lancashire Age Groups** held at Bury, Gala No.1 of 3, whereby for several swimmers it was their first time competing in events and distances they had not swum before. In total the swimmers achieved a total of 11 medals on the day: six 1st, four 2nd and one 3rd place with no fewer than 32 personal bests.

William Harrison was the outstanding swimmer achieving four 1st places from four swims (100m Freestyle, 50m Butterfly, 100m Backstroke and 50m Breaststroke). Other successful swims included: Joshua Finch achieving two 1st places (50m Butterfly and 50m Freestyle) and a 2nd place (100m Breaststroke); Emily Cott achieved two 2nd places (50m Backstroke and 100m Freestyle); Morgan Hartley achieved a 2nd place (50m Breaststroke) and Sam Bainbridge achieved a 3rd place (50m Breaststroke).

Amongst the other swimmers the following all set new personal bests in various events: **Charlotte Beech** (100m Freestyle, 50m Breaststroke and

ASA National Masters Championships

Affiliated Club

On the weekend of Friday, 27th to Sunday 29th of October, five members of the Colne ASC Masters team travelled to Sheffield's Ponds Forge International Sports Centre to take part in the ASA National Masters Championships. The star performer was **Stephen Smith** who won Gold in the 100m Freestyle and Bronze in the 50m Freestyle events for the 35 to 39 years age group, equally as impressive was **Karen Driver**, also in the 35 to 39 years age group, who took Silver in the 1500m Freestyle event.

The first event of the meet was the gruelling 1500m Freestyle where **Karen Driver** finished 2nd in a new personal best time of 19 minutes 27.52 seconds taking 12 seconds off her previous best, and this with a bad shoulder. Also competing was **Bob Whittaker** who finished 4th in a new personal best of 19 minutes 53.61 seconds in the 35 to 39 years age group and **Rachel Ingham** swimming in the Senior Age group (18 to 24) who finished 4th in a personal best time of 21 minutes 49.21 seconds.

Next up was **Philip Croxall** also swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group who finished a disappointing 11th in the 200m Freestyle with a time of 2 min 22.28 sec.

On the Saturday morning **Philip** was joined by **Stephen Smith** in the 50m Freestyle, where **Stephen** finished 3rd in 25.33 seconds, which was his best time for over 15 years, and **Philip** was 10th in 27.52, which was also a new personal best.

Saturday afternoon, **Karen**, **Bob** and **Philip** took part in the 400m Freestyle event where **Karen** finished 5th in 4 min 57.28 sec, **Philip** finished 9th in 4 min 53.28 sec and **Bob** in 11th in 5 min 1.57 sec, which was a new personal best.

Sunday morning saw **Karen**, **Rachel** and **Bob** take part in the 800m Freestyle where Karen finished 4th in 10 min 8.34 sec. **Bob** was 10th in 10 min 32.39 sec and **Rachel** with a new personal best of 11 min 29.61 sec finished 11th. Straight after the 800m **Rachel** went into the 50m Breaststroke and finished 10th in 41.18 sec.

Sunday Afternoon saw **Stephen** triumph in the 100m Freestyle in a personal best equalling time of 54.89 seconds. **Philip** finished 8th in 59.28 seconds which was also a new personal best time.

On Sunday the 22nd October, 14 swimmers competed at the **Warburtons Central Lancashire Age Groups** (Bury), Gala No. 2 of 3, whereby the swimmers carried on the success from the first gala with a total of 12 medals being achieved on the day; seven 1st, three 2nd and two 3rd places with no fewer than 20 personal bests.

Joshua Finch and **William Harrison** were the outstanding swimmers achieving three 1st and one 2nd place each. Joshua won gold in the 100m Butterfly, 100m Freestyle and 50m Backstroke with silver in the 50m Breaststroke. William won gold in the 100m Butterfly, 50m Freestyle and 50m Backstroke with silver in the 100m Breaststroke. Other successful swims included: **Emily Cott** achieving a 1st (100m Backstroke) and a 3rd (50m Butterfly); **Sam Bainbridge** achieving a 2nd place (50m Butterfly); and a 3rd place for **Morgan Hartley** (50m Butterfly).

The following swimmers all achieved new personal bests in the various events; **Joshua Finch** (100m Butterfly and 50m Backstroke), **William Harrison** (100m Breaststroke, 50m Freestyle and 100m Butterfly), **Emily Cott** (200m Individual Medley and 50m Butterfly), **Olivia Pratt** (50m Breaststroke and 50m Backstroke), **Megan Locke** (50m Breaststroke), **Jack Coyne** (50m Breaststroke), **Ainsley Dibb** (50m Freestyle and 50m Backstroke), **Francesca Harrison-Bradley** (50m Freestyle), **Chris Bates** (100m Breaststroke), **Sam Bainbridge** (100m Backstroke), **Simon Hardwick** (100m Freestyle and 50m Breaststroke), **Morgan Hartley** (50m Freestyle) and **Kieron Hartley** (50m Butterfly).

ASA North-East Region Masters Championship

On the weekend of 23rd and 24th September, 6 members of the Colne ASC Masters Team travelled to Scarborough to compete in the ASA North East Region Short Course Masters Championships. It was a good meet for the old Colne swimmers as they achieved 12 first places, 7 second places and 3 third places.

Swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group were Bob Whittaker, Stephen Smith and Philip Croxall. Bob was in impressive form as he won the 50m, 100m and 200m Backstroke events, the later in a new personal best time. He also finished 3rd in the 200m Freestyle.

Stephen finished 1st in the 50m and 100m Freestyle events, with him being the fastest swimmer overall for the 50m event in a time of 25.98.

Philip won the 200m Breaststroke and was second in the 100m Breaststroke and 200m Freestyle, and was third in the 100m Freestyle and 100m Individual Medley events.

In the 50 to 55 years age group was Janet Kirk who finished 2nd in her only event of 50m Breaststroke. In the 60 to 64 years age group was Tony Catterall who won all of his events which were 100m Individual Medley, 100m Breaststroke, and the 200m Butterfly, Backstroke, Breaststroke and Freestyle events.

In the 65 to 69 years age group was John Penswick who finished second in all of his events which were the 50m Butterfly, Backstroke and Breaststroke, and the 100m Breaststroke.

Teaspoon Gala

At the City of Sheffield Teaspoon Gala held at the Ponds Forge International Sports Centre Joshua Finch (open) won 50m Butterfly and was 6th in 50m Breaststroke and 13th in 50m Backstroke. Whilst Emily Cott (13) set new personal bests in all her swims as she won 50m Freestyle and finished 2nd in 50m Butterfly and 50m Backstroke. Josh also swam in a relay team for Haslingden, as Emily swam for Rosegrove in the relays.
