British Swimming Masters Championships

From Friday, 20th June till Sunday, 22nd June some 600 competitors travelled to Manchester's Aquatic Centre to take part in the British Masters and Senior Age Group Championships (50m) 2008. Five members of the Colne ASC Masters Team joined them.

Karen Driver swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group managed three first places as she won the 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle events. She was also third in the 200m Freestyle event. Stephen Smith in the 40 to 44 years age group won the 50m Freestyle event and was second in the 100m Freestyle losing by 2 hundredths of a second! He also did the 200m Freestyle but could only manage 5th place. The time he managed in the 50m Freestyle was also the fastest time has ever managed as a masters swimmer.

Tony Catterall in the 60 to 64 years age group won the 200m Individual Medley, was second in the 200m Breaststroke and 4th in the 1500m Freestyle.

Philip Croxall in the 35 to 39 years age group finished 3rd in the 200m Breaststroke, was 4th in the 50m Breaststroke and 5th in the 100m Breaststroke. He also did the 50m and 100m Freestyle events in which he finished 8th place in both races. The time he managed in the 50m Breaststroke was also a lifetime personal best.

Bob Whittaker also swimming in the 35 to 39 years could only manage 4th place in the 1500m Freestyle, his one and only event.
