Chris completed the course in 11 hours 20 minutes and 12 seconds to finish 14th in the 55 to 59 years age group.

The IronMan Triathlon comprises of a 2.4 mile (3.8km) swim, 112 mile (180km) bike and a 26.2 mile (42km) run.

# National Masters Championships 2008

From Friday, 24th October till Sunday, 26th October over 1000 masters competitors descended upon Sheffield for the asa National Masters and Senior Age Group Championships, held at the Ponds Forge International Sports Centre. Five members of the Colne ASC Masters Team joined

The star performers were **Karen Driver** and **Stephen Smith**, who between them won 3 national titles. Karen swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group dominated the 1500m Freestyle event winning in a time of 19 minutes 11.97 seconds which knocked off an incredible 16 seconds off her personal best. She also finished 2nd in the 800m Freestyle in 10 minutes 5.63 seconds which was also a new personal best, and was 4th in the 200m Freestyle in a time of 2 minutes 22.62 seconds.

Stephen swimming in the 40 to 45 years age group showed that he is the fastest 40 year old on the country by winning the 50m Freestyle in 24.74 seconds, which was a lifetime personal best. He also won the 100m Freestyle in a time of 54.90 seconds and was 2nd in the 200m Freestyle with a time of 2 minutes 7.10 seconds.

John Penswick swimming in the 70 to 74 years age group finished 3rd in the 1500m Freestyle with a time of 31 minutes 24.76 seconds which was a personal best.

Bob Whittaker swimming in the 35 to 39 years age group finished 6th in the 1500m Freestyle with a time of 22 minutes 4.16 seconds.

Philip Croxall also swimming in the 35 to 39 years age groups finished 4th in the 200m Breaststroke with a time of 2 minutes 47.49 seconds, was also 4th in the 400m Freestyle with a time of 4 minutes 45.22 seconds which was a new personal best by 4 seconds.

He also finished 6th in the 200m Individual Medley with a time of 2 minutes 33.98 seconds, which again was a new personal best, and was 8th in the 100m Breaststroke with a time of 1 minute 16.96 seconds.
