"PUBLIC BATHS situated in Ludgate Circus consists of one adult swimming pool 75 feet long by 30 feet wide with showers, foot baths and 105 dressing cubicles. A Iso a childrens swimming pool 30 feet long by 18 feet wide. Plus six private baths for males and four for females, two domestic baths and one remedial bath."

My own personal memory apart from the pool itself is of the old fashioned spin dryer for towels. It bore no resemblance whatsoever to the one you have at home.

I t might be the centenary of the old pool but there is much more important centenary coming up isn't there? Should you be puzzled look on your membership card.

On Saturday, 7th March, we travelled to Preston's West View Pool to take part in our first fixture of the new Micro League season.

Swimming against teams from Carnforth, Preston and Newton Hall. The young swimmers of Colne started the season well winning 12 of the 32 individual races with 26 of them in new personal best times. They also won 6 of the 17 relay events including the big 8 x 25m Mixed Cannon Freestyle Relay.

This ensured that Colne finished on top with 138 points with Newton Hall 2nd on 123, Preston 3rd with 121 and Carnforth 4th with 97 points

On Sunday, 29th March, we again travelled to Preston's West View Pool to take part in our next Micro League Fixture. Swimming against teams from Preston, Clitheroe and Kirkham, Colne continued their fantastic start to the season by winning with 155 points. Preston finished in 2nd with 147 points, with Kirkham 3rd on 104 and Clitheroe 4th with 79 points. During the course of the gala there were 9 new personal bests set by the Colne swimmers, 3 by the boys and 6 by the girls.

Important News: Changes to Permitted Swimwear Rules

Following a meeting of the FINA Bureau in Dubai, the Bureau decided to revise the requirements for swimwear approval with a view to making them clearer, simple and transparent. To that end, they issued a 4-page document entitled the "Dubai Charter" which came into immediate effect (from Saturday 14th March 2009). The full charter can be found on:

For all British Swimming events, the above has been adopted with immediate effect. This means that competitors may only wear **one swimsuit** in one or two pieces which shall not cover the neck, **extend past the shoulder**, nor past the ankle. No additional items, like arm bands or leg bands shall be regarded as parts of a swimsuit.
