#### **ASA National Masters**

The ASA National Masters and Senior Age Group Championships (25m) 2009 were held at the Ponds Forge International Sports Centre, Sheffield from Friday, 23rd October until Sunday, 25th October. Amongst the 1000 competitors were three members of the Colne ASC Masters team, who managed to achieve 2 golds, 1 silver and 4 bronzes between them, with Karen Driver competing in the 35 to 39 years age group and Stephen Smith and Philip Croxall both competing in the 40 to 44 years age group.

**Karen** was the first in the pool on Friday afternoon as she took on the challenge of the 1500m Freestyle (60 lengths of the pool). Despite struggling with tiredness she managed to win by 2 seconds from her nearest challenger. Her efforts clearly took a lot out of her as she struggled to a disappointing 5th in the 400m Freestyle. Despite this Karen returned to the pool after a night's rest and put in a gritty performance in the 800m freestyle to take bronze.

Philip was in the form of his life as he recorded a string of impressive performances which included three bronze medal winning swims in the 400m Freestyle in a time of 4 min 42.46 seconds (knocking 3 seconds off his personal best time), the 200m Individual Medley in 2 min 32.50 seconds (which equalled his personal best) and the 200m Freestyle in a time of 2 min 13.49 seconds which was only 0.07 seconds slower than his personal best. Philip also recorded strong performances in the 100m Individual Medley knocking 0.16 seconds off his personal best in a time of 1 min 9.61 seconds finishing in 7th place, the 50m freestyle finishing in 12th place in a best time of 27.00 seconds and finally he still had enough energy to record a lifetime best in the 100m freestyle finishing in 8th place in 59.09 seconds, with only a 10th place in 100m Breaststroke being a disappointment. In all; a truly remarkable effort over the three days of competition.

On the final day of competition **Stephen** had his final attempt of the year to break the British record in the 50m freestyle; despite recording a lifetime best of 24.72 seconds (missing the record by only 0.19 seconds) he was beaten into second place in a very tight finish by only 0.03 seconds. Later in the day Stephen came back strongly in the 100m freestyle winning Gold in another tight race in a season's best time of 54.90 seconds claiming victory by a mere 0.06 seconds.

All three swimmers are now looking forward to a rest after a long season with the next major target being the Word Masters Championships in Sweden next summer.

#### Hawaiian 'IronMan' Triathlon

Teacher Chris Domoney yet again made his pilgrimage to Hawaii to take part in the gruelling 2009 Kona Hawaii Ironman World Championship Triathlon.

This event comprised of a 2.4 mile sea swim, a 112 mile bike ride and a 26.2 mile run.

Chris finished in an impressive 4th place in his age group (60 to 64 years) in a time of 11 hours 27 minutes and 31 seconds. His swim taking 1 hour 31 minute and 1 second, the bike 6 hours 3 minutes and 9 seconds, and the run 3 hours 45 minutes and 39 seconds. Overall he finished in 965th position.

Congratulations to Chris on an amazing achievement.

#### **North Lancs Level 3 Meet**

On the weekend of 10th and 11th October, Colne ASC had 10 swimmers taking part in the North Lancs Swimming & Water Polo Association, 9-14 year Level 3 Meet, held at the Palatine Pool, Blackpool. Over the course of the weekend there were three 1st places, and two 3rd places, along with no fewer than 7 (seven) speeding tickets for swimming too fast.

The three star performers were **Abbie Hampshire** (9), Samantha Titterton (10) and Charlotte Titterton (12); with Abbie winning 50m Backstroke, but getting Speeding Tickets for 200m Freestyle, 200m Backstroke, and 100m Individual Medley, with a 5th in 50m Butterfly and 6th in 50m Freestyle; Samantha winning 50m Butterfly, and getting Speeding Tickets for 100m Individual Medley, 200m Backstroke and 200m Freestyle; and Charlotte winning 50m Breaststroke, along with 8th in 50m and 100m Freestyle, 9th in 100m and 200m Breaststroke, 11th in 200m Freestyle, 15th in 50m and 100m Backstrokes and 16th in 200m Individual Medley.

Also attaining 3rd place finishes were **Morgan Hartley** (13) finishing 3rd in 100m Butterfly, 4th in 50m Freestyle, 5th in 50m Breaststroke and 50m Butterfly, 6th in 200m Individual Medley and 200m Freestyle, and 7th in 100m Freestyle; and **Jack Coyne** (12) finished 3rd in 50m Freestyle, 5th in 100m and 7th in 200m Freestyle.

**Katie Farrar** (12) who finished 13th in 100m Breaststroke and 22nd in 200m Breaststroke, but got a speeding ticket for 50m Breaststroke.
