### ASA National Masters Championships

From Friday, 29th October until Sunday, 31st October nearly a thousand swimmers descended upon Sheffield for the British Gas ASA Masters and Senior Age Group Championships (25m) and four of the masters were from Colne. The eldest was **John Penswick** in the 70 to 74 years age group, next were Stephen Smith and Philip Croxall who are both in the 40 to 44 years age group, and lastly the youngest was **Karen Driver** in the 35 to 39 years age group. Between them they acquired one silver and seven bronze medals.

The first event on the Friday was the gruelling 1500m Freestyle event which comprises of 60 lengths of the pool. John was the only Colne representative and he finished with the bronze medal despite cramping up after 50 lengths.

The evening session saw Stephen and Philip tackle the 100m Freestyle where Stephen despite a poor start finished in 3rd place. Philip also suffered from a bad start managed to finish in 9th place, despite being in 12th at 50m. Finally John returned to the pool to finish in 3rd place in the 50m Breaststroke with a seasons best time of 50.09 seconds, which was over a second faster than his previous best for the year.

On Saturday morning Philip took to the pool for the 100m Breaststroke where he finished 8th in 1 minute 16.34 which was his best time for over 3 years. The afternoon events saw Philip storm to bronze in the 200m Individual Medley after being in 12th place after 100m and with 50m to go he had pulled back to 7th place, and in the last 25m stole 3rd place in a time of 2 minutes 28.83 seconds taking almost 4 seconds off his lifetime best. Stephen then took to the pool for the 50m Freestyle where he finished 2nd in a time of 25.06 seconds missing out on the title by 0.05 of a

The evening session prompted the arrival of Karen for her 400m Freestyle event where she finished 4th. In the mens event Stephen finished in 9th place leaving him feeling sick as Philip snatched his second bronze of the day with a storming finish as he claimed third place in the last few strokes of the race to record a time of 4 minutes 42.07 seconds, which again was a new personal best.

Sunday morning came and the clocks went back giving the swimmers that much needed extra hour. First up in the pool was Karen who finished 3rd in the 800m Freestyle in a new lifetime best of 10 minutes 5.29 seconds. Then it was Stephen and Philip in the 100m Individual Medley where Stephen finished 4th in 1 minute 6.36 seconds and Philip was 6th in 1 minute 8.05 seconds which was a 1.45 second improvement of his lifetime best.

Sunday afternoon saw the final session of the weekend and it was an event too far for Philip as he finished in 8th place in the 200m Breaststroke. Last up was Stephen who had two races in half an hour, the first being the 50m Butterfly where he finished 5th in a time of 28.74 seconds missing out on a medal by less than half a second, and he then took bronze in the 100m Backstroke which was also the last event of the meet.

### Championship Gala

This years Championship Galas will take place on Monday, 15th and Thursday, 18th November. The warm-up starts at 6:45pm on each night, with the gala starting at 7:00pm.

Entries can either be done online or via forms which can be collected from Joan Croxall or downloaded from the website.

Entry for the gala is free, and you can even enter on the night.

## **North Lancs Level 3 Meet**

On the 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> October, Colne ASC had 15 swimmers competing at the North Lancashire Level 3 Meet (Blackpool Palatine), all the swimmers gave a good account of themselves and for the majority of swimmers it was their very first time competing. A total of 5 medals were achieved on the day with two 1<sup>st</sup> places, two 2<sup>nd</sup> and one 3<sup>rd</sup> place, with no fewer than 48 personal best times and 5 speeding tickets for those swimmers that went quicker than the qualifying time.

In the 9yr Age Group: **Joshua Cooke** finished 19<sup>th</sup> 50m Backstroke and 25<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle with the former in a personal best time; **Charlie** Hesketh finished 15th 50m Backstroke and 24th 50m Freestyle all in personal best times.

In the 10yr Age Group: Abbie Hampshire achieved a 2<sup>nd</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 8th 50m Butterfly, 8th 50m Backstroke, and speeding tickets in the 200m Breaststroke, 100m Individual Medley, 200m Backstroke, 50m and 200m Freestyle all in personal best times; Sarah **Pickles** finished 16<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 26<sup>th</sup> 200m Breaststroke, 25<sup>th</sup> 50m Butterfly, 28th 50m Backstroke, 39th 50m Freestyle and 34th 200m Freestyle with four personal best times; **Lucy Green** finished 40<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 22<sup>nd</sup> 50m Butterfly, 33<sup>rd</sup> 50m Backstroke and 40<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle all in personal best times; Gregan Baker achieved a 1st place in the 50m Freestyle and 16<sup>th</sup> 200m Freestyle in personal best times; George Connolly finished 13th 50m Freestyle; Theo Rowan finished 24<sup>th</sup> 50m Backstroke and 21<sup>st</sup> 50m Freestyle in personal best times; and Bradley Duffield finished 24th 50m Breaststroke in a personal best

In the 11yr Age Group: **Nicole Baxter** finished 33<sup>rd</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 34<sup>th</sup> 100m Freestyle, 41<sup>st</sup> 100m Individual Medley, 25<sup>th</sup> 50m Butterfly, 34<sup>th</sup> 100m Backstroke, 32<sup>nd</sup> 50m Backstroke, 20<sup>th</sup> 200m Backstroke, 32<sup>nd</sup> 50m Freestyle and 25<sup>th</sup> 200m Freestyle with six personal best times; **Dominic Hartley** achieved a 1<sup>st</sup> place in the 50m Backstroke, 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the 50m Butterfly, 7<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle and 19<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke all in personal best times; and **Leo Wilson** finished 25th 50m Freestyle in a personal best time.

In the 13yr Age Group: **Jack Coyne finish**ed 6<sup>th</sup> in the 200m Individual Medley, 7<sup>th</sup> 50m Butterfly, 12<sup>th</sup> 50m Breaststroke, 6<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle, 9<sup>th</sup> 100m Freestyle and 7<sup>th</sup> 200m Freestyle with personal best times in three events; and Isaac Rowan finished 9th 50m Butterfly, 10th 50m Breaststroke, 9<sup>th</sup> 100m Breaststroke, 7<sup>th</sup> 50m Freestyle, 12<sup>th</sup> 100m Freestyle and  $9^{\text{th}}$  200m Freestyle with personal best times in six events. In the 14yr/Over Age Group: **Morgan Hartley** achieved a 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the 100m Butterfly, 10th 200m Individual Medley, 7th 50m Butterfly, 5th 50m Breaststroke, 6th 100m Breaststroke, 7th 200m Breaststroke, 8th 50m Freestyle, 11th 100m & 200m Freestyle with personal best times in five events.
