World Masters Championships

Karen Driver returned home from the 14th World Masters Swimming Championships. Riccione Italy with Two Top 10 finishes a 6th & 7th

After a long days travel of over 12 hrs, some tired swimmers arrived at their destination Riccione Italy to take part in the 14th World Masters Swimming Championships.

Sunday was the first day of racing and an early start for anyone wanting to warm up - 6.30am for racing to commence by 7.30am. Sunday saw just one event being run the Men's and Women's 800m Freestyle.

With over 1100 swimmers taking part in this event. The women were in the indoor pool and Colne Swimmer Karen Driver was in Heat 52, competitor number 527.....it was going to be a long day!! After waiting around all day, with no chance of a proper warm up in the overcrowded warm up pool, Karen took to the water at 8.15pm, although finishing in 7th position, Karen was disappointed with her final time, as she had swum much faster only a few weeks earlier. But considering the circumstances it was 65 to 69 years age group were representing Colne a gutsy performance.

Karen's Second and Fun event 200m Freestyle on the Tuesday This year the medals were determined upon an age again saw her in Heat 55, swimming alongside Olympic Gold adjusted formula on the swimmers time, which Medallist Claudia Poll (1996 Olympics in Altanta, USA). Karen meant that it was possible for a 50 year old to beat a being seeded 30th in this event, moved up the rankings to finish in 25 year old! a creditable 15th.position.

Karen's Final swim, at the end of a long, tiring week, saw the 400m Freestyle being swum in the outdoor pool and not letting her disappointing 800m time get her down, Karen stormed to a PB Breaststroke, 200m Freestyle and 50m Freestyle. and a 6th position with a time of 4 minutes 59.06 seconds, which was a surprise as she was not seeded within the Top 10. However she knew if she swam really well, she could just about squeeze in, so to gain a 6th position was a tremendous result for Karen. She really swam hard and was determined to do well and her final position showed her determination to do this.

Karen will now take a well earned rest before starting preparation positions were 6th, 7th, 19th, 14th, 6th and 11th in for next year's Europeans in Eindhoven 2013.
